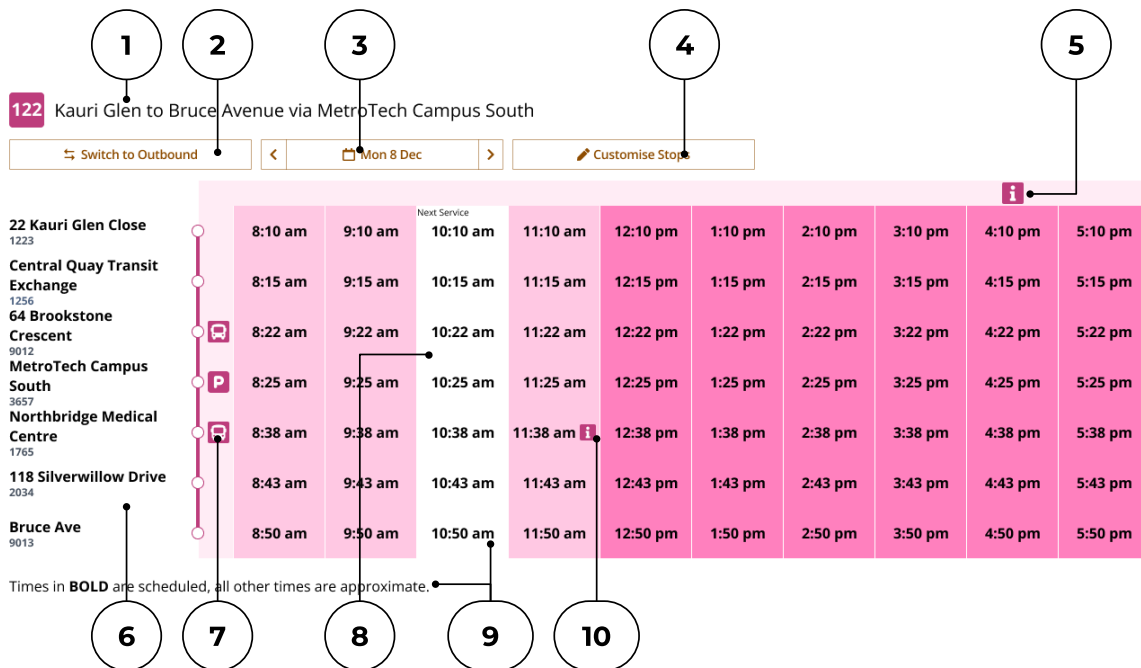


How to read Ride Guide Timetables



Understanding the timetable layout

- ✓ Stops are listed down the left-hand side
- ✓ Times run across the page
- ✓ Each vertical row is one bus trip
- ✓ Light shaded times are AM, dark are PM

1. Route Number & Name

2. Switch Direction

Use **Switch direction** to view the trips going the opposite way.

3. Date / Service Day

Select your travel date to view the timetable for that day. Greyed-out dates indicate the service does not run. Some routes may operate different schedules on weekends or holidays.

4. Adding an Intermediate Stop

You can use **Customise Stops** to insert any stop along the route. This helps you check a stop that isn't shown by default. You can also select to show all stops within this list.

5. Trip Note

Select the note to view important trip specific details. Notes may indicate changes to the usual service.

6. Stop List

If you don't see your stop, use **Customise Stops**.

7. Connections & Amenities

If you see a bus icon beside a stop name, it means you can connect to another route there or nearby. Tap the icon to view connecting services and their associated stop. Nearby amenities will also be shown.

8. Next Service

This highlights the next trip after the current time, if looking at today's timetable.

9. Scheduled vs Approximate Times

Bold times are fixed schedule timepoints. Non-bold times may vary slightly depending on traffic.

10. Stop Note

Select the note to read important details about this stop, including special pick-up or drop-off conditions.
