RE: Application by Eastland Port to develop twin berth facilities.

Ernslaw One Ltd fully supports the Twin Berth Project at Eastland Port.

The district of Tairawhiti is a wonderful place to live, work and do business. However, we are challenged on many fronts including relative remoteness, our roading infrastructure, geology and reliance on Port infrastructure which has its own challenges such as exposure to the southerly swells. Any initiative designed to improve our efficiencies and competitiveness of exporters in the world has to be positive for the entire district. Ernslaw One believes the project proposed by Eastland Port will greatly assist in achieving these. The project is required to accommodate the growing volume of log exports and this will give assurance to those many businesses which have invested in the local forest industry.
